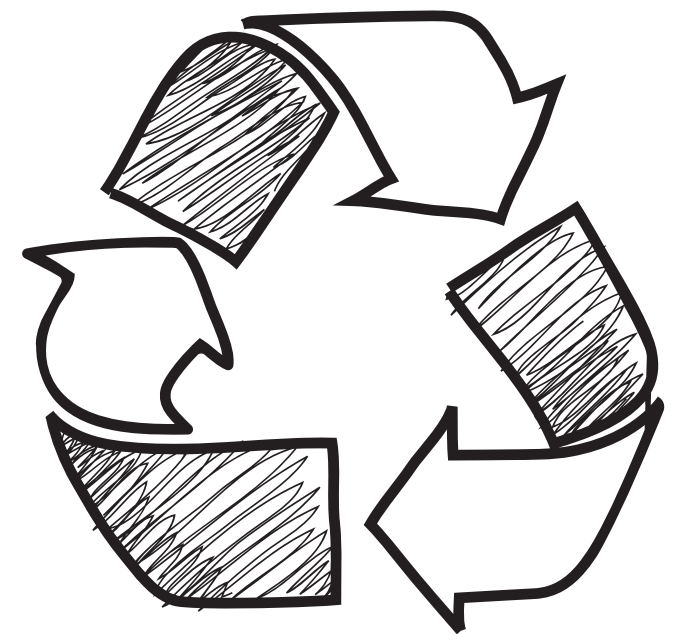

2025 EVENT OVERVIEW

EVENT PURPOSE

The Citywide Cleanup Event is one of North St. Paul's most popular annual events. The Cleanup gives NSP residents the opportunity to **dispose of unwanted junk/items for free** at our Public Works Facility. The Citywide Cleanup **prioritizes recycling whenever possible** to promote the City and County's goals of sustainable best practices.

The Citywide Cleanup takes place **annually on the second Saturday in May.**
