Subject: Subsequent Year-End Transfer Request from General Fund to Pandemic Response Fund

Background/Facts:

- On March 20, 2020 staff created the Pandemic Response Fund to account for costs associated with Covid-19.
- On July 6, 2020 the City of North St. Paul received \$916,062 in CARES Act Funding.
- On November 10, 2020 the City of North St. Paul approved resolution 2020-132 which allocated \$505,178 for business relief grants and \$410,884 for reimbursement of public safety expenditures.
 - The City chose to allocate \$410,884 for public safety expenses for administrative convenience and to reduce costs associated with the required Federal Single Audit associated with the grant.
 - Guidance from the United States Treasury for State, Territorial, Local and Tribal Governments outlined in their Frequently Asked Questions, most recently updated on October 19, 2020, indicated that local governments “may presume that payroll costs for the public health and public safety employees are payments for services substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency”.
- The City has coded unbudgeted expenditures to the Pandemic Response Fund, including:
 - Disinfectants & Cleaners
 - Hand Sanitizer
 - Face Masks & Face Shields
 - Gloves
 - Thermometers
 - Covid Testing
 - Remote Desktop Licenses
 - Online Meeting Software Licenses
 - CivicPlus CivicRec Park Reservation Software License
 - CivicPlus CivicClerk Online Agenda Software License
 - OpenGov Citizen Services (formerly Permitting, Licensing and Code Enforcement) Software License
- As of December 31, 2020 the Pandemic Response Fund has 296,739.82 of expenditures in excess of revenues.

- Staff anticipates continued use of this fund for personal protection equipment (PPE), technology and personnel costs associated with the pandemic.
- In order to resolve the existing deficit and account for ongoing expenditures, staff is recommending a one-time transfer from the General Fund to the Pandemic Response Fund in the amount of \$410,884.

Recommendation: Staff is requesting Council approval of the attached resolution transferring \$410,884 from the General Fund to the Pandemic Response Fund retroactive to December 31, 2020.

**RESOLUTION APPROVING 2020 YEAR END TRANSFER FROM GENERAL FUND
TO PANEMIC RESPONSE FUND**

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020 the City of North St. Paul created a new a new fund (Pandemic Response Fund) to account for unbudgeted costs associated with Covid-19; and

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provided federal funds to the State of Minnesota and the legislature and Governor thereby distributed these funds to local governments throughout Minnesota to deal with the financial impacts of COVID 19; and

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2020 the City of North St. Paul received \$916,062 in CARES Act Funding; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2020 Resolution 2020-132 was approved which allocated \$505,178 of CARES Act Funding for business relief purposes, for specific business in good standing with the Minnesota Secretary of State and Minnesota Department of Revenue and current on property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the remaining \$410,884 of CARES Act Funding was allocated to reimburse the City for the regular public safety payroll expenditures, consistent with Federal and State direction, that these expenditures shall be deemed due to the public health emergency related to COVID 19, not accounted for in our regular budget process as a part of an administrative convenience for itemization and within the time period of March 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City of North St. Paul has incurred many additional expenditures related to COVID-19 but for administrative simplicity and otherwise having adequate expenditures for public safety payroll during the expense period have chosen not to itemize these expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Pandemic Response Fund has no funding mechanism and as of December 31, 2020 expenditures exceed revenues in the amount of 296,739.82; and

WHEREAS, staff anticipates unfunded expenditures associated with the management of COVID-19 will continue until the pandemic is over and restrictions are lifted;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the North St. Paul City Council approves a transfer from the General Fund to the Pandemic Response Fund in the amount of \$410,884 retroactive to December 31, 2020.

Subject: American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)/State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (FRF)

Background/Facts:

On Thursday, March 11th President Joe Biden signed into law the \$1.9 trillion relief and stimulus package known as The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) after amendments were made by the Senate and subsequently passed by the House of Representatives.

Among the provisions within the act which include direct payments to individuals and an extension of unemployment benefits, \$350 billion of Fiscal Recovery Funds (FRF) will be sent to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments for lost revenue, increased expenditures and mitigation of economic harm caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- \$195 billion for states, (a minimum of \$500 million for each State);
- \$130 billion for local governments (a minimum of \$1.25 billion per state is provided by the statute inclusive of the amounts allocated to local governments within the state);
 - \$45.9 billion for cities over 50,000 in population
 - \$19.5 billion for cities under 50,000 in population
- \$20 billion for tribal governments; and
- \$4.5 billion for territories

Preliminary estimates, which are subject to change, indicate a total maximum distribution of \$1,524,181 to the City of North St. Paul. The approximate amount of funding for Minnesota local governments with populations under 50,000 is ~\$100/per capita. The ARPA will be subject to both periodic financial reporting and federal single audits.

Distributions will be split into two even allocations. The first half will be sent to the State of Minnesota within 60 days of the bills enactment. The state is then required to allocate funding to local governments 30 days after receiving funds from the federal government, unless an extension is filed by the state. North St. Paul should receive initial funding Wednesday, June 9th. The second half will be received no earlier than 12 months after the first distribution.

The limited information staff has regarding qualified uses of this funding comes directly from the bill itself. The Treasury department is responsible for issuing detailed guidance regarding eligible expenditures and the administration of ARPA payments. Staff will provide City Council with additional information as it becomes available.

Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund

- \$130 billion for local governments split evenly between municipalities and counties.
- \$65 billion allocated to cities through a modified Community Development Block Grant formula as follows:
 - \$45.9 billion for cities over 50,000 in population (CDBG “entitlement communities”).
 - \$19.5 billion for cities under 50,000 in population (CDBG “non-entitlement communities”).

Allocation Method

- Population over 50,000 utilizing a modified Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) formula
- Population under 50,000 allocated according to population share but will not exceed 75% of their most recent budget as of January 27, 2020

Allocation Method for Cities <50,000

- Approximate Amounts for MN local units of Government
$$\frac{\text{Population of City}}{\text{Population of State}} = \frac{\text{Appropriation to City}}{\text{Appropriation State received for all cities <50,000}}$$

~\$100/per capita for cities under 50,000

Two Distributions

- 1st half 60 days after enactment
 - The State shall distribute payments no later than 30 days after a State received a payment.
 - An extension may be granted to the State due to an extensive administrative burden.
- 2nd half not earlier than 12 months after first distribution

Eligible Uses

- Assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits to aid in the response to the public health emergency or to aid hard-hit industries such as tourism, travel and hospitality
- Premium pay for essential workers
 - An amount up to \$13 per hour that is paid to an eligible worker in addition to wages the worker otherwise received.
 - For all work performed by the eligible worker during the COVID-19 public health emergency.
 - May not exceed \$25,000 per eligible worker.

Eligible Uses

- Revenue replacement for the provision of government services to the extent the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency (FY 2019)
- Investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure

Eligible Transfers

- Nonprofit organizations
- Public benefit corporation involved in transporting passengers or cargo
- Special purpose unit of government
- State
- Tribal organizations

Not-Eligible Uses

- Funds cannot be used to directly or indirectly offset tax reductions or delay a tax/tax increase
- Funds cannot be deposited into any pension fund

March 11: Enactment of law

About May 10: 60 days after enactment (likely first distributions)

About June 9: Distributions by state (unless MN files an extension)

About May 10: Second distribution

Building Typologies: Residential



Housing is often a challenging subject for local governments. Trying to find ways to house more people while retaining the locale's character is a hard balance to achieve. The purpose of this analysis is not to pass judgment on any particular type of home or its residents, but rather to inform the public of the costs associated with different housing typologies.

The vast majority of our work at Urban3 has demonstrated that suburban design is largely unable to return in tax revenues what it uses in infrastructure costs. Further, according to the University of Michigan, the number of people who live in an urban environment is only increasing.

The intention of this analysis is not to suggest that all suburbs should be demolished and replaced with apartment towers, but rather that future developments should increase density, promote walkability and improve the balance of revenues and costs for local governments.

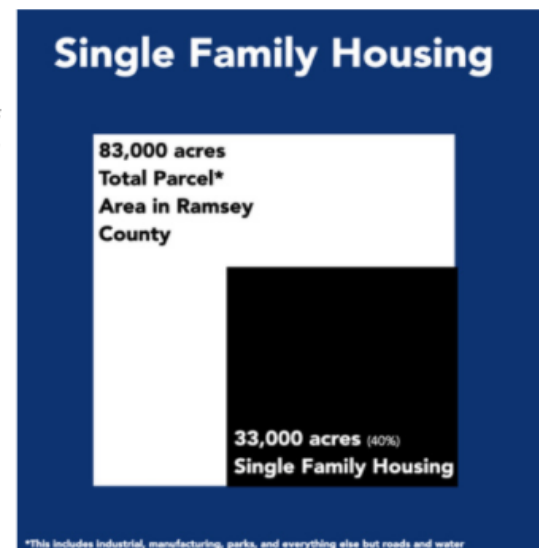


Figure 10.1- 40% of Ramsey county is single-family housing parcels

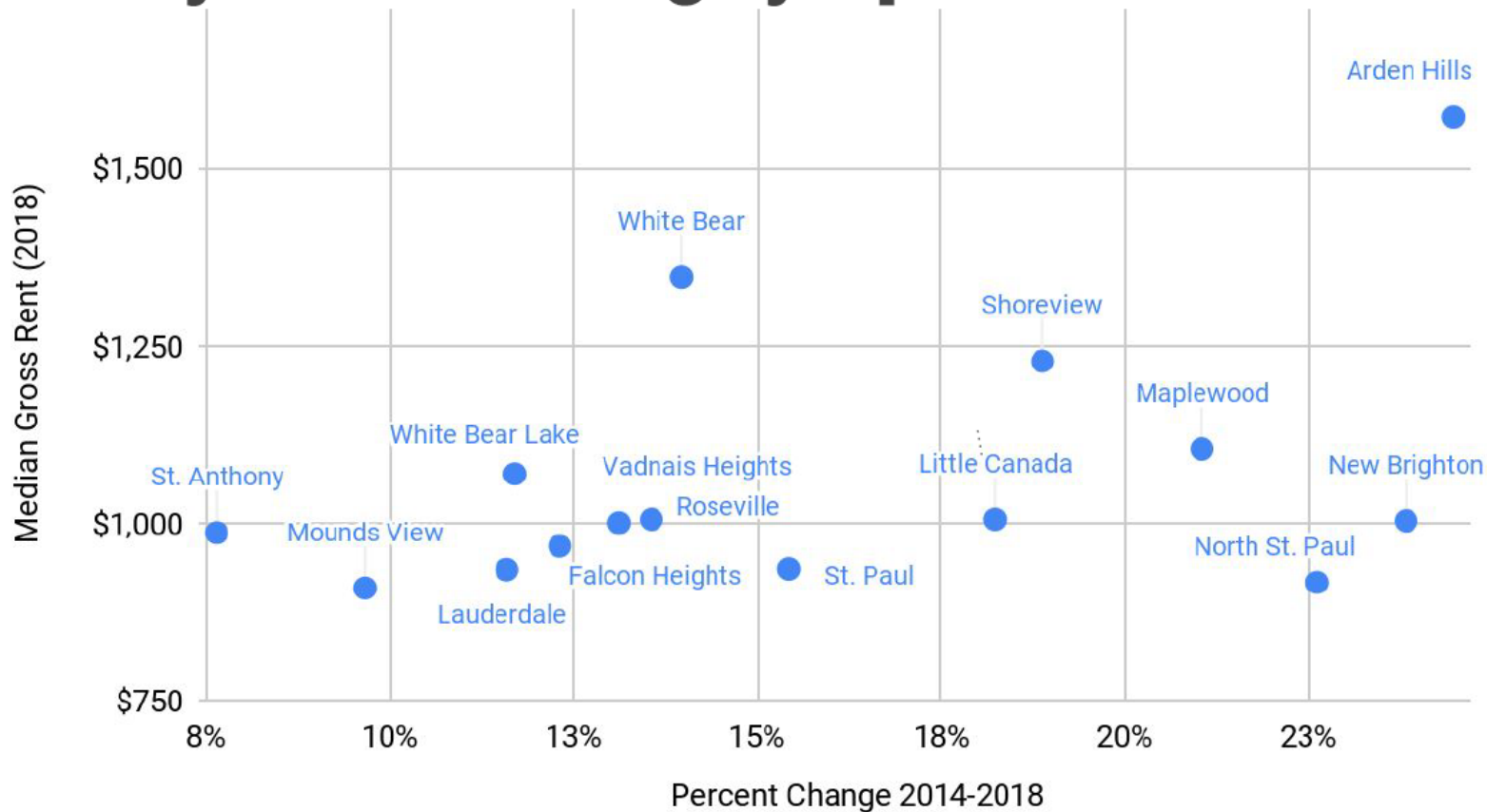

What We Learned....

- Ramsey County has an existing gap of over 15,000 affordable units for those that make less than 30% Area Median Income
 - This results in more “cost-burdened households” or households that pay more than 30% of their income on rent
- North St. Paul remains relatively affordable for homeownership and renting, but rents are quickly increasing
 - Rents increased approximately 23% between 2014-2018
 - Home values increased about 5% in the same period
- North St. Paul to consider continued investment in the existing housing stock to ensure affordability, and housing stability for current and future residents

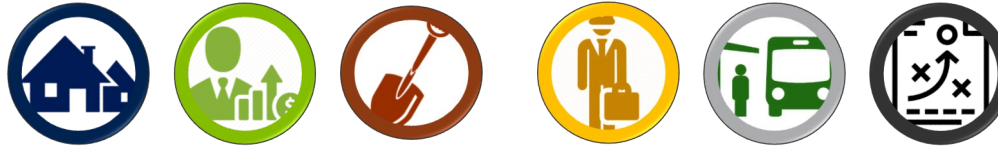
Investments in North St. Paul

- In the last 20 years Ramsey County CED has invested approximately \$2.5mil in North St. Paul
 - Over 6% of all CED investments were in NSP, NSP has about 2.2% of the county's population, and represents 1.67% of the County tax base
 - Most funded projects were for single family home rehab and first-time homebuyer programs
 - Other investments from the Environmental Response Fund (ERF) and CDBG helped fund economic development projects.
- Currently constrained by available federal funding/programs
- Countywide HRA would increase opportunity for investment in North Saint Paul.

What would an HRA levy mean for NSP?

- Ramsey County is the only county in the Twin Cities metropolitan area that does not actively levy for affordable housing.
- A County-wide levy would raise up to \$11.6 million a year to fund affordable housing and redevelopment projects.
- Funds collected through a Ramsey County HRA Levy would be balanced across St. Paul (50%) and suburban Ramsey County (50%) to support:
 - Preservation of existing and creation of new affordable housing
 - Build community wealth through stronger pathways to homeownership.
 - Advancing redevelopments to assist with housing, business retention, attraction, and expansion.
- Ramsey County's HRA plans to begin levying in 2022.
 - Communities that had active HRA levy authorities prior to 1971 are statutorily required to pass a Resolution to participate in Ramsey County's levy.
 - Currently applies to the cities of Saint Paul and North St. Paul.

- Existing HUD Programs – Restricted to Suburban RC
- Narrow eligibility
- Resources are limited

What we heard: Can you help with our projects?

- MN Housing Consolidated RFP -*Multi-Family & Single-Family Preservation and Supply*
- NOAH Impact Fund/NOAH Preservation
- Single Family Rehab/Energy Efficiency
- Emergency Repair (equity retention/at-risk properties/life safety)
- Lead Removal-Healthy Homes (life safety)
- -1st Time Homebuyer/Down payment Assistance (equity creation)
- Land Trusts/Site Acquisition to support mixed-income housing

Environmental Funding & Support

Existing - Environmental Response Fund:

- Program that is countywide, policy directive for 50/50 funding support across St. Paul and Ramsey County
- Previously focused on soil contamination
- In last couple years we expanded into building contamination/abatement

What we heard: Need additional resources and greater flexibility

- Fund Geotechnical corrections
- Vapor mitigation (responsive to expanding EPA/MPCA rules)
- Support Phase I and Phase II investigations, site demolition and acquisition

****More aggressive in going after third-party grants (federal EPA, state, philanthropic, etc)**

Redevelopment Planning & Assistance

Existing: 2019-2020 Pilot: Corridor Revitalization Program (Planning Funds)

- Remains flexible funding, early planning dollars
- Will need dedicated resources to continue program

What we heard: Flexible funding for early planning revitalization assistance along critical corridors or main streets.

- Program expands from planning to pre-development funds
 - Strategic Acquisition/Repositioning Fund/Façade Improvement/Place-making
 - Equitable Development gap financing - along critical transit/transportation corridors
 - Business Incubation

Innovation Funds for Economic Competitiveness

What we heard: *Limited funding to advance innovative ideas in Ramsey County*

Funds set aside to advance creative proposals in the areas of:

- Workforce Development, flexible funds
- Resiliency – Energy efficient models and technology
- Housing Models/Products – New Modular and/or energy efficient housing product ideas that reduce housing cost-burden

Next Steps...

- As a result of the age of HRA, City of St. Paul and North St. Paul would need to pass a Resolution of Support to allow the County to expand its area of operation County-wide.
- A draft Resolution for consideration has been sent to your Administrator.
- City of St. Paul to consider later this month.
